

Turner, then DA & D.M.G. after my correspondence with him of Apr 1st 1919. After further communication with him in Mombasa on the matter, Col. Turner finally took the letter to the Chief Paymaster Gen. War Office, on his return to Mombasa on leave for South Africa, informed me that the application would be granted.

I am encouraged to write to you, as the Rev. P. W. Ness, our Senior Chaplain of the Forces, in an official letter dated 10th Sept 1919 when leaving the Country, thanked me for all the good work I had put in for the Chaplains Dept etc. and that he would mention my work to you when he saw

I have not been involved out of the copies as a result of overwork necessitated by these military duties, I have

was ordered to leave East Africa on medical grounds.  
I enclose a copy of a statement by my two wardens  
the Mombasa Cathedral indicating the brief nature of  
the work I did as the Military Chaplain there. I have  
received no decorations for these services.

The last ~~and~~ correspondence on my application was from  
the 1st May 26<sup>th</sup> from Lt. Col. J.C. Ward, who informed  
that Major Rumbor, A & I.M.G. had referred the application  
to the War Office, advising me to register my home address  
with the Chief Pay Master, Ed. Pay Corps. But I have heard  
nothing of the matter since.
