Sir,

I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to acknowledge your letter of the 15th ultmo (1491/1918-19) enclosing a copy of a despatch from the Officer administering the Government of the East African Protectorate regarding a contribution by Mr. Abdul Kasul Allidina Visram for the benefit of the widows and orphans of British soldiers, European and Indian, who have fallen in the present war.

I am to request that you will convey to Mr. Abdul Kasul Allidina Visram the Minister's sincerest thanks on behalf of the Ministry of Pensions for this act of generosity towards the widows and children of those who have laid down their lives in the Empire's service.

I am further to state that the Minister condurs [redacted] in the suggestion of the Secretary of State for the allocation of two-liners of the amount to an Indian organisation and of the remaining one-third to a British organisation.

In providing for the welfare of children whose parents have been killed, provision has been made in part through the Society of Friends of the Ministry of Pensions, the Committee of Arrangements, the Department of the Health and Education, which are used and maintained by the Government of India, and also to meet these purposes the Government of India has accordingly provided the subject to a sum of £1,000/- for Mr. Abdul Kasul Allidina Visram, the Administrator of the balance of £1,000/- given him (after making the £1,000/- given to a British Indian organisation) he entrusted to the Simla Branch Committee of this Department, who are in touch through their Local Pensions Committees, with the object of using throughout the United Kingdom, and are in a position to advise in such case how a supplement may best usefully be spent in the interests of the individual child.
