Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 14th ultimo, No. 8771/1919,

addressed by the Minister of Pensions to acquaint you that
in the absence of any evidence as to the nature and degree of
disability for which the late Sergeant [Name] was discharged,
it is not possible to say definitely what pension would have been
admitted in a similar case occurring in the British Army.

In regard to the widow's claim to pension, there is no evidence as to the cause of death, but assuming it to have been the same as that for which he was discharged and considered a widow would be eligible for pension at the appropriate rate set down in Article 14 of the War Department Regulations and for a weekly children's allowance under Article 15 of the same Regulations.

If, however, the cause of death was otherwise, the pension would not exceed one-half that provided for a widow as set forth in Article 14 of the War Department Regulations.
