I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to acknowledge the
receipt of your letter No. 6990/1918/19 of the 21st ultimo, with
reference to the deceased's pension payable to her widow,
Mrs. Elizabeth Clotworthy McMillan, East Africa Mounted Rifles,
to inform you that had the soldier been serving in the British
Army at the time of his death, his mother would have been eligible for
a pension at the rates specified by the Acting Governor of the
East Africa Protectorate, i.e. 5/- a week up to 3rd April, 1917,
and 15/- a week from 4th April, 1917 onwards.
