Re Capt. A.A. Reid, East African Pay Corps.

With reference to your letter 57417/19 of the 6th instant on the subject of the above mentioned officer, I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to inform you that it is regretted that no reason can be found in this Department of your letter dated 4th January dealing with this case.

I am to say for your information that the retired pay of an officer of the Imperial Forces, who is incapable of managing his own affairs as a result of mental instability, is paid to such officer's next of kin on their undertaking to expend in his interests. In cases where a Committee or Receiver is appointed for the officer's estate, all the retired pay is issued to the person or persons named in the Order of the Court, after a copy of the Order in Lunacy has been submitted for the information of this Department. In cases where it is not intended to appoint a Committee or Receiver, the next of kin is asked to sign an undertaking on a special form, a copy of which is attached, and the retired pay is issued on this form being duly signed and returned to the Ministry.
