I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No. 8967/18/19 dated 21st February relative to the case of ex-Staff Sergeant F.M. Storm, late of the East Africa Pay Corps who was invalided on the 14th October 1918 for Jacksonian Epilepsy and to whom a final gratuity of £75 plus £22.10. for rank has been awarded. In reply, I am to acquaint you that the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that the Medical Branch of this Ministry have been consulted and have expressed the opinion that the description of Mr. Storm as suffering from Epilepsy on the Army Form B.179, is well founded and is derived from genuine Epilepsy, and not from some other disease, and therefore the fit are datable as due to the injuries received in France during the war, and thus to or exaggerated by the time of his discharge and is admissible at 30%, but that it is not possible to ascertain whether the disability was due to the circumstances of the war or to pre-existing circumstances the award would have been at the rate of 1/6d per week, or the ordinary rate of 8/3 per week. In making this award it is necessary to take into account the sum of £100 remitted from your letter, has been deducted. The practice of the Ministry is to deduct the sum of 1/6d a week from the gratuity paid until the same is refunded.
