I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to acknowledge receipt of your communication of the 8th instant, No. 220393/1919 enclosing a copy of a despatch from the Governor of the East African Protectorate together with a Medical Report on the case of Mr. J.H. Portland, Head Conductor East African Transport Corps, and to inform you that in the opinion of the medical advisers of Ministry to whom the papers were submitted, the disability should be regarded as due to service, amputating him to the extent of 20% in the general list.

4m. It is felt that the Minister is not entitled to pension
by virtue of rank, but taking "Head Conductor" as
equivalent to Conductor or Sub-Sub-conductor in the
Ordinance Corps (i.e. Warren Officer Class 1.) pension
should be awarded on the basis of 45% per week, under the
visions of 1st Schedule Part I. This amount is exclusive
of allowances and dependents if any, which by the meaning
of Article 34 is given in the Royal Warrant of 17th April, 1918.
It is suggested that the following weekly rates :-

SYMPTOMS OF LEFT KNEE JOINT.

Statement of Case

Give briefly the essential facts of the history of the disability, noting entries in the Medical History. Slight bursitis in knee.

Adm. to 3rd, C.S., Nairobi on Oct. 5th with a fusion in left knee joint and pain in L. shoulder, hip and back. Had review and rhombism in the field in 1914, at one instant in hospital, no evidence of it, but on admission to hospital no evidence of arthritis or rheumatism.

Swelling in left knee joint a year ago, now gone, and joint remains very stiff. No other evidence of disease or deformity.

In 1914 admitted to hospital with a fracture of the right arm, which was amputated. He has had no military service since then. His present condition is the same as when he was admitted in 1914 (see on page 1).

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
