I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to acknowledge the receipt of your letter (No. 365/1919) of 12th April, and in reply I am to acquaint you, for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that the award of 37/6 a week for 6 months from 26th October 1918 made by the Governor of the East African Protectorate in the case of Company Sergeant Major M.C. Barrance, late East African Military Labour Corps, No. 5508, corresponds with the award which would have been made to him had he been a serving soldier in the British Army.

It does not appear from the papers that there are any children within the meaning of Article 24 (3) of the Royal Warrant of 17th April 1918 in respect of whom Mr. Barrance would be entitled to allowances. The Copy of the Medical Report is retained as requested.
