In reply to your letter of the 22nd May, 1919, concerning the disability compensation of the Reverend T.B.R. Westgate, formerly a Chaplain with the East African Expeditionary Force, I am directed to acquaint you that had this officer been a member of the Imperial Forces, he would be eligible for an award of temporary retired pay at the rate of £87-10-0 a year from the date of the relinquishment of his commission till the 22nd January, 1920, about which date he would be asked to appear before a Medical Board in a view to a further consideration of his case.
