Sir,

I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 10th May (No. 9132/1918/19) and in reply I am to acquaint you, for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that had Mr. Ducrotoy been a serving soldier in the British Army, boarded on 25th October 1918, and assessed at 40% disability, he would have been awarded a pension of 11/- a week with children's allowance for 5 children of 9/8d a week, for 12 months in the first instance.

The children's allowances shown in the Acting Governor's letter of 27th December 1918 appear to be calculated on the basis of 100% disability instead of representing only 40% of the rates in Article 2 of the Royal Warrant.

If, however, Mr. Ducrotoy had been boarded on his discharge on 20th March 1916, he would have been entitled to pension and allowances under the 1915 Warrant at probably the half rate (12/6d a week plus 6/3d a week for children) and when reboarded on or after 4th April 1917, ~~he~~ pension at the same rates as in the present Warrant (11/- a week) plus only 7/- a week for children's allowances until 1st May 1918 when the present rates came into effect.
