Mr. Wedgwood, — To ask the Secretary of State for the Colonies, whether he has seen the suggestion made by Mr. Couper before the Native Labour Commission that, in order to get forced labour and at the same time get round the difficulty which might be made by the Colonial Office, he would suggest that the forcing of the Natives to work be termed forced education; and whether he will watch in future the educational proposals of the East African Government, with a view to preventing the introduction of slavery under any such term.
