Wrote from S.A. attached in which you
will see that in 1876 in October 1876 he
was employed by the Government as a draftsman
and in July 1877 he had been employed
with his present firm as Water Engineer for two years
and had been employed for the rest of
his life for the office of the same firm until he
left the office of the Government. I should be glad
to hear with certainty about his application for the same
and although everybody seems to have been agreed that
it was not unlikely that he was entitled to any
money in account of his services, he got an advance
of £20. Now he won't refund the £20, you must
either justify that application to S.A. which is rather difficult
or else you must apply to the Legislature.

his being entitled to the money we should
not have put the board to the test in March
as to how far we could go in order to
avoid any claim for a statement that
we had been in possession of the money
during the time he was entitled to

I have been in full control of construction erection &
maintenance work for the past six years.
I have two children, age 32 years.
I have been employed with my present firm for
years.
