I have the honour to inform you that a Mining Company has offered me employment on the Gold Coast. You have an application of mine under consideration for an appointment under the Colonial Office. Could this please be cancelled and my services released as early as possible to enable my accepting this? I am desirous to sail on the 23rd instant, if accommodation is available.

Regarding the question of my taking a permanent Commission in the Regular Forces, I should be glad if this also could be withdrawn, and the attached letter forwarded to the Army Council.

I should have been very gratified had an appointment been granted me under the Colonial Office, but, as a married man, do not consider it justifiable to wait without a certainty in view.

I suppose the question of my gratuity will now be considered and respectfully point out that it would be for five years, viz: - 372 days pay at the rate of pay I was drawing under the Royal Warrant on 11th November 1918 (as a Staff Captain). I have the confirmation of this from the Finance Department, War Office. This would be also
