Your 38410/19 of 5/6/19, I have the honour to take the following
claims additional to my service gratuity.

1. Child Allowance from Dec. 1st, 1917 to March, 4th, 1919, at £2, p.m.
The Crown Agents have remitted me this from March, 5th, 1919, but
will not pay arrears without your authority. I came on to Colonial
Rates of Pay as a Staff Captain 23/R/18 receiving pay (£200, p.m.)
plus Colonial Yield Allowance. This entitles me therefore to the
Child allowance mentioned. The allowance was first authorised 1/10/17
and I therefore claim arrears from that date.

Additional Bonus due to Officers whose Demobilization has been sus-
pended, pending a decision as to whether their services are to be
retained or not. (A.G. Instructions, 778 of 23/4/19). This would
therefore entitle me to £1/5d, per week from Dec. 1st, 1918, (Army
order 54 of 1919) to 11/7/19, vis. 28 weeks.

Your 32818/19 of 18/6/18, (para. 2), my claim for 1/- per day increase
of pay is based on para. 228 Royal Warrant for Pay. I completed 3 years
in my rank 27/4/18 and my 12 years service and pay made up as follows:

With regard to the question of my service Gratuity, prior to 2/2/17, I respectfully ask that this may be based on the pay of a Staff Captain. My Commissioned service was continuous from 10/5/15.

With regard to my desire ~~for appointment to the General or Special Reserves of Officers or the Territorial Forces~~, I beg that my seniority and rank may be credited to me and should I not be appointed to any of these, that I may be allowed to retain my rank with the usual privileges.
