Dear Sir,

Owing to my oversight in not sending with my original application for a farm in British East Africa, evidence of my Army service and testimonials which I am now unable to be required as I am now a medical official of the Ministry of Pensions, I was not included in the ballot. Therefore by the time I had been able to furnish the evidence required, the ballot was over, and the best of the medical farms had been allotted. Of those that were left I selected one numbered 1279 B, but I find that I made a very poor selection due to lack of sufficient information which I had not previously obtained and studied the catalogue. This was because I thought the matter was ended when my name was not included in the ballot. As I intend to take my family out there, I am advised that I should not take a farm at a lower altitude than 5000 ft. Besides I desire to be in a better locality as to quality of soil, and prospects of medical practice.

Will you therefore be so good as to allot me another farm which fulfills these conditions, and yet is not too far to the west or near remaining medical farms so that I can be available for me, therefore I have exchanged my number 770 B. I will do this by next week.

If, however, the question of exchanging farms now rests with the Governor of the Colony, will you very kindly present my views favourably to His Excellency?
