The subject of an armistice in Africa has been discussed by all troops engaged on the latter Patrol, and it is agreed that Sodden 1917-18, & most respectfully and strongly recommend such a medal be approved for issue.

In the course of operations the opposition met above tribes was very strong, and the fighting experienced of heavy nature, over a difficult country, where drought conditions obtained, thus inflicting great hardship on the officers and other employed on the patrol.

The punishment inflicted on the members of the patrols on several occasions fighting very fierce and hard, and our troops during these affairs suffered many casualties in killed and wounded. Some of the fighting noted were the fiercest of my experience of nearly ten years active service.

The figures of cattle and camels (if British) are not at the moment available to me, but they include about 1000 camels, killed or captured, 11,000 head of cattle, some thousands each of camels, dogs and sheep. The following figures which I have not destroyed can be compared with those given above. No comparison can be made between the opposition offered by armed Hereros and Northern Tribes in view of the different numbers of between 2000 & 3000 (including hundred tribes and sub-tribes) to above figures.

Commander in chief that their splendid work should not
be unregarded, and that they may be fully
rewarded.
