(a) In reply to your letter of the 15th ultmo, ref. 64187/1919, I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to advise you that the information of the Secretary of State to the Colonies that the case of Sergeant W. Gwynne, late of the East Africa Regiment, has been considered in accordance with your request.

The Medical Advisers of the Ministry have examined the copy of the Medical Report which accompanied your letter and express the view that the disability would have been assessed under our rules at 30% for twelve months from the 19th September 1919. Had Sergeant Swanson served under British Army Regulations the appropriate award under the Royal Pensions Warrant would have been a disability pension of 14/- per week from the 19th September 1919 to 21st September 1920, together with allowances for wife and children (if any) coming within the scope of the Warrant.

Towards the end of the period covered by the award an examination by a Medical Board would take place and the pension be reviewed accordingly.



## STATEMENT OF CASE.

The following statement is made by the officer in his own handwriting, giving all available information concerning the officer's disability, his evidence being corroborated by his medical officers whom he has selected.
