Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 27th ultimo,
No. 66841/1919, I am directed, by the Minister of Pensions,
to acquaint you, for the information of the Secretary of
State for the Colonies, that had the late Driver P. Bright
Williams, East African Mechanical Transport Corps, been
serving in the British Army at the date of his death his
widow would have been eligible for pension at the increased
rate of 26/8d a week for herself and 10/- a week for her
child with effect from the 3rd September, 1919. In the
event of the child ceasing to be eligible for an allowance
before the widow attained the age of 40 years, her pension
would be reduced to 20/- a week pending reaching that age.

I am to add that copies of the Royal Warrant
referred to are not yet available.
