

The Under-Secretary of State for the Colonies
permits his compliments to the Director of Movements at
the War Office, and in reply to his letters No. 13/Gov
No/1918/1 (d.R.I.a Rep.t.) of the 4th and 25th of November
addressed to the Consul Agents for the Colonies, is directed
to inform him that the telegram from the General Officer
Commanding, Cap Town, of the 3rd of October apparently
refers to Personnel of the East African Local Forces return-
ing to East Africa, who are not entitled to detention
allowances if delayed at Durban, unless they are still in
the Service, and that reference in cases of doubt should
be made to the Commandant of the King's African Rifles
or senior military officers in East Africa.
