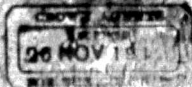

14027 Certain Repatriated Crown Agents Passengers
COMBIE CASTLE will be detained DURBAN awaiting
Transshipment to E. AFRICA. Please inform me if
Conditions of W. O. Telegram 21866 29/7 applies
for claims to detention allowances.

The Under-Secretary of State for the Colonies presents his compliments to the Director of Movements at the War Office, and in reply to his letter No. 13/Gen No/1025 (S.P.L.A. Reg. 1.) of the 4th and 28th of November addressed to the Crown Agents for the Colonies, is directed to inform him that the telegram from the General Officer Commanding, Cape Town of the 11th of October apparently refers to Personnel of the East-Africa Local Force returning to East Africa, who are not entitled to detention allowance if delayed at Durban, unless they are still in the Service, and that reference in case of doubt should be made to the Commandant of the King's African Rifles, as senior military officer in East Africa.
