With reference to Colonial Office letter  
dated 1919, of the 8th instant, regarding the grant of  
pension and education allowance to the widow of the late  
Lieutenant T. W. Patrick, East Africa Unattached List, I am  
directed by the Minister of Pensions to inform you that if  
the officer had served under British Army Regulations, she  
would have been eligible for the following awards:-

To Mrs. Patrick a pension of £75 a year for herself, and an allowance of £4 a year, until disqualified, in respect of her child Thomas Wylie Patrick.

These grants are as provided by the Royal Warrant  
of 1st August, 1917, for the family of an officer who  
dies of disease attributable to or aggravated by military  
service during the war.

Mrs. Patrick might also, if in pecuniary need, be  
assured education expenses actually incurred not exceed-  
\$200 a year for her child. The grant and continuance  
of allowance would depend on the Minister being  
satisfied as to the education the child was receiving.
