With reference to Colonial Office letter of the 8th instant, regarding the grant of a pension and education allowance to the widow of the late Lieutenant T. W. Patrick, East Africa Unattached List, I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to inform you that if this officer had served under British Army Regulations, the widow would have been eligible for the following awards:-

To Mrs. Patrick a pension of £76 a year for herself, and an allowance of £24 a year, until disqualified, in respect of her child Thomas Wylie Patrick.

These grants are as provided by the Royal Warrant of the 1st August, 1917, for the family of an officer who died of disease attributable to or aggravated by military service during the war.

Mrs. Patrick might also, if in pecuniary need, be reimbursed education expenses actually incurred not exceeding £50 a year for her child. The grant and continuance of the allowance would depend on the Minister being satisfied as to the education the child was receiving.
