PAYMENT OF RAILWAY CHARGES

States have heard Madras Authorities threaten to stop soda traffic unless freight is paid in rupees at  $1\frac{1}{4}$  per rupee. Paints say terms of contract and cannot consent to pay freight in any other medium than that of £ sterling. Requests Authorities be cabled to carry out terms of contract.

The freight conditions of the contract are in clause 42 (soda) & clause 45 (plant - apparatus). The rate is stated in sterling & nothing is said either as to set off deduction into rupees (for local payment) or as to whether payment should be made locally or in England. Of course in 1911 no one thought of any rate per ton rupee but  $1\frac{1}{4}$ .
