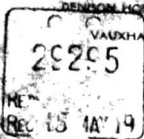

Sir,

ml I beg leave to acknowledge your letter of yesterday, No. 26884/1919 enclosing a copy of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1915, East Africa Protectorate, for perusal and return. Your letter will be brought before my Committee at the first opportunity.

2. Meanwhile I beg to ask whether a copy of the Society's letter of 1st May has been forwarded to the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate as requested in the third paragraph, or whether the Secretary of State would prefer that we should send it to His Excellency direct. I presume that there will be no objection to our forwarding a copy to East African newspapers?
