Dear Sir,

I am desired by the East African Section of this Chamber to refer to the Bill relating to Electricity Supply which has been recently introduced in the East African Legislature.

The East African Section desire me to say that a copy of this draft ordinance has just come into the hands of some of the members of the Section and they feel that the provisions of the ordinance may, if passed into law, seriously affect many enterprises already established in British East Africa, the capital embarked in which has been provided from England.

Arrangements have been made for this draft ordinance to be examined by an expert Sub-Committee of the East African Section and the object of this letter is to express the hope that the Secretary of State will make such representations as will prevent the Royal Assent being given to the ordinance for the time being.

A memorial on the subject will at an early date be presented to the Colonial Office setting out the objections to many provisions thereof.
