Dear Sir,

I beg to inform you that at a meeting of the East African Section of this Chamber held on Wednesday last there was under consideration the question of the increased railway rates on the Uganda Government Railway. Telegrams as following were reported from the Uganda and Nairobi Chambers of Commerce:-

"The Chamber protests in the strongest and most emphatic terms against unwarrantable imposition of the crushing increase in the Uganda Railway rates of forty to seventy per cent for the sole benefit of East Africa Revenue hereby crippling all vital industry in Uganda which provides enormous proportion Uganda Railway revenue. Appeals to Government suspended operation immediately pending fullest enquiry."

"Nairobi Chamber unanimously supports Uganda Chamber's protest against recent increase railway fares rates request immediate suspension pending enquiry".

The Section unanimously adopted a resolution to the effect that it was generally understood that some advance in rates is necessary in order that the Government revenue may be increased but the Section is of opinion that the incidence of the increase upon various articles needs careful consideration. I am, therefore, on behalf of the Section, to express the hope that the operation of the increase will be suspended for a reasonable time in order to afford an opportunity for the effect of the increase on the various articles affected to be examined. The Section has appointed a Sub-Committee for this purpose.
