Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of December 3rd 1919 (No. 62402/1919) with reference to the issue, as a supplementary publication to the Tropical Diseases Bulletin, of the pamphlet by Colonel W. G. King, C.I.E., on "Vaccination in the Tropics".

2. I note that the Crown Agents for the Colonies have been instructed to arrange for the payment of the cost of publication of the pamphlet from Government Funds, and I am placing myself in communication with them on the subject.

3. In order to enable me to estimate the size of the edition required I should be glad if I may be supplied with figures of the numbers of Medical Officers in each of the ten tropical African Dependencies.

4. With a view to bringing the publication to the notice of the non-african tropical Colonies and dependencies, advertisements of the pamphlet will be inserted in the Tropical Diseases Bulletin. I should also propose to send copies of the pamphlet to the more prominent Medical Corps in Great-Britain, America, France, the Indian Empire, etc. for review.
