We have received a telegram this morning from our client Mrs Anderson  
at Nairobi stating that Mr Rudolf Frans Meyer, who is also a client  
of ours, has been arrested as a German subject. Mrs Anderson and I  
left England on about the 1st with for Nairobi where they had  
lived for many years in partnership carrying on a newspaper business. We  
instructed that Mr Meyer had been residing in Nairobi for some time  
earlier, and shortly before he left England he requested to be naturalized. It was  
necessary to obtain his naturalisation, but we found that as he had not  
resided in this Country he was not entitled to naturalisation although we  
understood a Bill was before Parliament to enable persons who had resided  
in the Colonies for a certain period to the same. Mr Meyer we were  
informed some time ago is in exceedingly bad health, in fact he is suffering  
from Cancer. If, therefore, you can do anything to assist him he  
will be most grateful. His address in Nairobi is c/o "The Standard".
