I beg to acknowledge your letter of the 4th inst.  
in which I am informed that the Secretary of State for  
the Colonies proposes to select me for appointment as  
Assistant Chief Accountant in the Post and Telegraph  
Department of the East Africa and Uganda Protectorate.

In the event of my accepting the offer it would be  
my desire that my wife and child should accompany me;  
perhaps, therefore, I can be informed if arrangements  
can be made for them to do so, and whether suitable  
accommodation would be available. It is understood  
that Government quarters free of rent will be provided.

May I also be informed if it is known in what part of  
the Protectorate my services are likely to be required,  
as it is thought that the duties of an Assistant Chief  
Accountant would probably be confined to the capital, or  
some principal town.

I am directed to point out that in the first notification  
of the appointment which appeared in the Post Office  
Circular the annual increment was stated to be £10, whereas  
the amount now mentioned is £12.

I am also to enquire if the expenses incurred in connection  
with my visit to the Medical Adviser will be defrayed  
by the Colonial Office.
