I beg to acknowledge receipt of the
above letter containing instructions as
to relinquishing my appointment in the
East Africa Forces, for which I
thank you.

In a previous letter sent to
you in reply to yours ^{MA} 54584.9.19 of 25th Aug.
I asked that a passage should be taken
as soon as after March 1st, which
you concur in yours 54501/19 of 27th Sept.
asked for the extension for the reason
of health. I would point out that
had in East Africa two very serious
illnesses, in 1918 and 1919, which were
caused entirely through active service in

at country; during a stay of 15 years
South Africa I never had an illness
of any sort. I did not therefore consider
it a vacation from the end of my tour
abroad, & it was sufficient to bring my
health up to the standard it was when
enlisted in the South African Forces,
and on that account I asked for
extension until March 1st, and I thought
that pay would continue until arrival
in South Africa.

My health is not as
good as it was previous to serving and,
I am without an income except
what I have saved. I would respectfully
ask that my pay and allowance, or
a thereof should be continuing until
at least, the date of sailing for South
Africa or alternatively that a gratuity
should be granted to me to provide for
myment of expenses during that time.
I would like to point out also that I dissolved
my partnership, in which I was making a
good living in order to go to the front.
Consequently on arrival in South
Africa I will have to start afresh.

I have to live and provide a home
in England for 3 months or more, it will
necessarily deplete my savings.
