I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your  
5/3/39 of yesterday's date and to return herewith duly filled  
up AF WSA.

With regard to your 3/3/39 the Crown Agents have adjusted my  
pay up to Feb 23rd inclusive, not Feb 24th and have informed me  
that I am not entitled to pay for the latter date. As your letter  
suggests I am, I shall be glad to hear definitely whether this  
is so or not.

As to my gratuity, I am of course claiming at the  
consolidated Corps pay rate of Rs. 375/- per month, to which  
we were both to understand in East Africa that we were  
entitled. I shall be glad if this sum of Rs. 2250/- d/f 168-9-2  
can be sent me as soon as possible.

from the War Office the King's Certificate issued to Home and  
Colonial officers and men who are discharged on account of  
disabilities contracted overseas, if you will grant me permission  
to change my rank and to that end cause a notification  
appear in the Gazette and if you will send me my formal  
commission.

I am etc. to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 28th of March, and to inform you that pay is not issuable for the day from which an officer relinquishes his commission, and that the letter from this Dept. of the 27th of March was not meant to imply that you will receive pay for February 24th.

2. Your gratuity is being assessed, and the amount will be forwarded to you by the C.A. for the Colonies in due course. This is so that war gratuities granted to members of the E.A. Forces are calculated on British Army rates of pay (in your case 11/- & 2/- per day) and not on African Recalibrated rates.

3. As regards your passage to S.A. I am to say that if, towards the conclusion of six months from the date of relinquishment of your commission, you produce evidence to show that you are unfit to proceed to S.A., the question of the extension of the period for which you are eligible for a passage will be considered.

that you relinquished your commission in the local  
forces on grounds of ill-health.

Cavaliers relinquishing their commissions  
are no longer granted honorary rank, but in certain  
circumstances they are permitted to retain the temporary  
rank which they held. It is not clear whether this will  
be possible in your case as you did not hold an Imperial  
commission, but the W.O. are being consulted in the matter.

The W.O. are also being asked whether your  
parchment commission can be furnished for transmission  
to you and whether you are eligible for the King's  
Certificate on discharge.
