I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your
25629/19 of yesterday's date.

I am more than surprised that, after having been dead
waiting for two and a half months, — during which period
I have received neither military pay, gratuity, nor disability
pay — I am awarded the totally inadequate retired pay at
the rate of £87-10-0 per annum for six years. I protest
against such an award, which I cannot accept. You are
aware of the fact that B. Daniels and the General
Staff Board consider me unfit to return to the tropics
to resume my previous employment and that my disability
is therefore one hundred per cent. In view of that

fail to understand on what basis the award is
calculated. I consider myself entitled (for the time being
and rate) to the maximum disability pay, for as I
am medically unfit to perform any work. 622

I shall be glad of a prompt reconsideration of my
claim, as I find it impossible longer to exist without funds.

3. You are at liberty to make an
application for alternative pension,
forwarding a statement of your pro-
cess earnings, in which case your eligibility
for such pension would be reviewed.
