I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your
25629/19 of yesterday's date.

I am more than surprised that, after having been held
waiting for two and a half months, — during which period
I have received neither military pay, gratuity, nor disablement
pay — I am awarded the totally inadequate retired pay at
the rate of £87-10-0 per annum for my service of protest
against such an award, which I cannot accept. You are
aware of the fact that S. Daniels and his Committee
of Appeal Board consider me unfit to return to the Forces
as my civilian employment now has no liability
and therefore one hundred per cent.

fail to understand on what basis the award is
calculated. I consider myself entitled (for the time being,
at least) to the maximum disability pay, to which
I am presently unfit to perform any work. 62?

I shall be glad of a prompt reconsideration of my
claim, as I find it impossible longer to exist without funds.
