With reference to your letter of the 15th inst. and the honor to apply for the maximum alternative pension from the enclosed statement by the local manager of taxes you will observe that in column in 1913 was £100 in the enclosed agreement of 20th inst. 1914. It being further stated that a subsequent income of £100 and £100 which latter into the agreement came into force was employed by the Libera Publica delati 1914. £100 per year of the agreement set out the yearly increments and no more my first term in the Comptroller's service. Therefore he would naturally be to go and my means salary would certainly not be less than £500 a year salary, medical attention and annual allowances.

3. The disability under which I am labouring is, you are aware, of such a nature as to make it impossible for me to return to the colony to resume my occupation. I therefore feel entitled to 100% disability compensation and claim such benefits. Furthermore, I think it but fair that I should receive a substantial gratuity. Although the doctors whom I have consulted hold out the hope of great improvement in my condition they are and all state that for the future I must forego all forms of physical exertion. That such a prospect interferes materially with a future chance, especially, as a planter, does not need to be emphasized, and should entitle me to a gratuity.

As to the assessment by the Ministry of Pensions my award @ £87-10-0 a year, I shall be glad to see what grounds it is calculated that it can be as temporary disability seems impossible from the smallness of my pension.
