

Dear Sir,

Respecting the shipment of Hides from Mombasa, in
British East Africa. We understand that all restrictions on
the export of Hides from Mombasa have been removed by the
Home Authorities, but the Chief of Customs at Mombasa states
that he has received no notice to this effect, and that
consequently the old regulation which prohibited the export
of all hides under 8 lbs weight is still in force. We shall
be glad if you will cable out to the officer in question
instructing him that the prohibition relating to hides under
8 lbs is removed, and that the export is now allowed.
