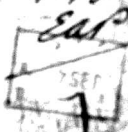

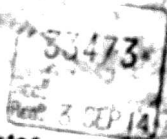

Sir,

Reference to Crown Agents letter No. W/4794, a copy of which is attached, I have the honour to inform you that my name is up before the British North Borneo Chartered Co., and other Engineering firms for employment as an Engineer on their staff.

As it is likely that reference will be made to you or the Crown Agents, I have the honour to enquire whether your replies to such enquiries are likely to be such as to seriously effect my chance of appointment.

I have the honour to point out that I as a married man, and suitable appointments are not easily come by, and that the recent trouble in East Africa was not such as should interfere with my future career. A certificate from you stating the period of my service in East Africa, and that I left on the termination of my Agreement, would oblige, and would doubtless avoid the necessity of further applying to you in the matter.
