With reference to my despatch No.20 of the 13th instant, I have the honour to report that I discussed with the General Officer Commanding the question of the status to be assigned to the punitive measures now being taken against the Turkhana.

2. General Wapshare was of opinion that they should be regarded as coming under the head of Military Operations, as he considered that, failing prompt and vigorous action against the tribe in question, they might become aggressive in the future, and embarrass, to a more or less extent, our main operations elsewhere.

3. I am therefore charging the extraordinary expenditure in connection with the expedition to War Expenses.
