With reference to my despatch No. 14 of the 9th instant, I have the honour to inform you that the Acting Provincial Commissioner, Kenya, met the Nyeri chiefs and headmen "in baraza" on the 22nd instant, and formally thanked them on behalf of the Government for their generous gift of 132 steers for the use of the troops.

2. In reply Wambugu, the paramount chief of the district, expressed satisfaction at this recognition of what they had done and added that they all appreciated the work the troops were doing to keep the enemy out of their country and that if Government required further assistance they were ready to give it.


3. This attitude is extremely satisfactory and is indicative of the feeling amongst the natives generally.
