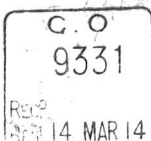

TREASURY MINUTE DATED 4TH // d MARCH, 1914.

By Lords read again the Treasury Minute of the 4th October, 1895, declaring the gross revenues of the British East Africa Protectorate to be a "Public Fund" within the meaning of No. 1 of the Rules under section 6 of the Superannuation Act, 1887.

By Lords are now pleased to determine and declare, with the concurrence of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, as from the 1st April next, the gross revenues of the East Africa Protectorate shall be no longer so regarded as a Public Fund.

Officers therefore who draw or have commuted naval or military non-effective pay or who have retired from the Imperial Forces with gratuities, and who are appointed to civil employment the profits of which are derived from the revenues of the East Africa Protectorate will no longer be subject to abatement from those profits under rule No. 4 and the remaining Rules appertaining to such employment.
