I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Read's letter of the 13th instant T/ (8728/1914) relative to the proposed appointment of Sir W. Taylor K.C.M.G. to be Chairman of the Inter Protectorate Committee with regard to the East Africa - Uganda Customs question.

In reply I am to request you to inform Mr. Secretary Harcourt that My Lords concur in the payment to Sir W. Taylor of remuneration at the rate of £100 a month when in East Africa and £50 a month on the voyage, in addition to expenses of locomotion but inclusive of subsistence. They also agree that these payments shall be divided equally between Uganda and East Africa Protectorate.

My Lords understand the proposal in paragraph 4 of the letter under reply to be that, before the Customs arrears are paid over, the Uganda share of the above expenses shall be deducted and only the net amount of Customs arrears credited to Uganda Revenues. It appears to Them to be more correct that the full Customs arrears should be credited to Uganda revenues - to which they in fact belong - and that payments in connection with Sir W. Taylor's services should appear in the Uganda accounts in the ordinary way and be met from savings on the authorised estimates. If such savings do not ultimately

ultimately accrue, My Lords would be ready in the special circumstances to agree to defray the expenditure (or such part of it as may exceed available savings) from balances.
