With reference to your telegram of 15th instant and my reply therete of yesterday's date on the subject of the erection of Indian married quarters by the Magadi Soda Company, I now have the honour to present to you the facts as furnished by the Hom'bls General Manager.

- When the Railway Administration took over the first section of the Magadi Line, a request was made to the Magadi Company for certain accommodation for the staff which it would be found necessary to employ at Kajiado Station.
- The accommodation asked for consisted of (a) married quarters for three Indians, and (b) a Goods Shed. No mention was made of Equipment for Repair Shop. The Goods Shed, though not mentioned separately in the specification, ormes under the term "Station Buildings."
