The Board having assembled proceed to read the report of Major Gilke R.A.M.S. and to examine Captain Brooke.

The Medical history indicates exhaustion by a tropical climate, which the loss of weight, shakiness and insomnia confirm. The blood count is not a normal one. Exposure to the sun brings fever and exhaustion. The Board are of opinion that Captain Brian Brooks is unfit for active service in tropical regions and recommend him for four months leave to England.
