I have the honour to inform you that I have communicated with the members of the Medical Department regarding the subject dealt with in the enclosures to your above-quoted communication.

2. From the perusal of the replies it would appear to be advisable pending more extended experience to retain and the maintenance of the principle laid down by Mr. Lytton in 1908 on the basis of Sir Patrick Manson's opinion. It may not be unreasonably expected that developments in sanitation and local food supply will influence any opinion which may be given hereafter in respect of the question raised and that, consequently, the future may contain a brighter African outlook for the victim of Blackwater Fever than that appears to exist at present.
