

East Africa Protectorate

The Governor of the East Africa Protectorate
to the Secretary of State for the Colonies
(Received Colonial Office 3.7 p.m., 9th April, 1915)

April 9th. Your telegram 26th March, Bacon Factory lease. Tannahill agrees with me that such an development obligation has been carried out will be best to grant new lease under 1902 Ordinance containing only general clauses of original lease and making provision for maintenance. Important that provisions of clause twentyone lease of April 20th 1910 should be retained. Terms of lease should be for residue of 29 years commencing October 9th 1908. Tannahill informs me that he said nothing which could lead Thomas to believe that right to freehold would be conceded. No such right can be claimed under 1902 Ordinance and under no circumstances should be granted. Final question referred to in your telegram had been foreseen by me. Have added second proviso to section 6 subclause five of the new land ordinance precluding application of that subclause to land leased for special purpose. It should be made clear in the new lease that it is a lease for special purpose as being part of original concession. Propose to pass land ordinance at next Council Meeting about end of April if your approval given in time.
