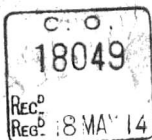

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Read's letter of the 8th ultimo <sup>for</sup> (10688/1914) transmitting by direction of the Secretary of State a copy of a despatch received from the Governor of the East African Protectorate reporting the amalgamation of the three subsidiary coinage accounts of the Protectorate, and stating that Mr. Harcourt proposes, subject to Their concurrence, to approve the Governor's action.
