This is a new post on the Estd 1915-16. The Govt states that the Act. Storekeepers on the Railway are too young for the post, and that there is no other officer suitable. The Govt. presumably means that no officer outside the R.R. Dept. is suitable.

The salary is £ 450-30-000 + £ 450. It would have been preferable to fill the post by the promotion of a Storekeeper in the Headquarters in the G.A.P. or in the C.I. service. E.g. the Storekeeper in the P.W.D. Dr C.W. Gregory, who is on the scale

£ 300-15-000 + £ 30.

There appear to be no other man in the P.W.D. who would do for such an important post.
