CONDITIONS OF SERVICE

Staff have been informed of improvements agreed to but date of introduction must depend on finances. Hopes to introduce new salaries in 1916-7. Question of houses or accommodation and allowances must stand over for some time. Proposed increase of baggage allowances and part of allowance should be adopted from July 1st.

With reference to your Confidential despatch of the 5th inst. I have the honor to inform you that I have caused a reply to be sent to the petition from the members of the Non-European Subordinate Staff embodying those improvements in the conditions of service to which you have agreed.

2. I have intimated that the date of bringing these into force must depend upon the finances of the Protectorate which have been seriously affected by the war.

3. I hope that it will be possible to introduce the revised scale of salaries next year and if the financial situation permits to make provision in the Estimates for 1916-1917.

4. I fear however that the question of house accommodation and the grant of allowances will have to stand over for some time. It is

estimated that the cost of creating the necessary quarters would amount to Rs 60,000, and there will also be the contingent liability of upkeep etc. There are about 360 clerks who in the meantime would require house allowances which at Rs 30 each per month would amount to Rs 540 per annum. I consider therefore that for the present we can do no more than admit the principle but the date and extent of its application must depend upon financial conditions.

2: I propose that the recommendation of the Committee in Heads VIII and IX of their report respecting the increase of baggage allowance on the Railway, and the grant of a portage allowance of Rs 1/- should be adopted as from July 1st and instructions have been issued accordingly. This will not involve any appreciable increase in expenditure.
