Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that some time ago, owing to the increase in the volume of correspondence connected with the accounts, I formed the opinion that it was necessary to take steps to minimize the number of references from the Treasurer to me on the subject of the writing off of stores, of refunds and of acceptance of explanation in reply to audit queries involving only small sums.
