MEMORANDUM

REVIEW OF JUDICIAL ACTS

Copy

The object of the Lunacy Amendment Ordinance, 1946, is to enable the manager of the estate situated in the Province of a lunatic residing elsewhere than in the Province to remit sums realized from the estate to the Court of the country in which such lunatic resides or to some person responsible for the lunatic's affairs in such country.

1. Under the Indian (District Courts) Lunacy Act, 1946, as applied to the Province all sums received by a manager or successor of an estate in respect of what may be required for the current expenses of the lunatic or of the estate must be paid to the Treasury on account of the estate for treatment (vide Section 18). If the lunatic resides outside the Province and has the major part of his property outside the Province, it is, I am of opinion, reasonable that the Court should have power to order the transfer of any surplus funds to the agency to treat the lunatic resides.
2. The power given to the Court has been judicially held general to order that the Court's order may be applicable to any set of circumstances which may arises.
