THE MINING AMENDMENT ORDINANCE, 1915

-----  
STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.  
----

The Mining Amendment Ordinance, 1915 has been enacted in pursuance of the opinion of the Secretary of State contained in Colonial Office No. 1083 of 18th December, 1914, for the purpose of removing the restrictions contained in the proviso to Section 73 Clause XXVI of the Mining Ordinance, 1912, on the imposition of royalty to be paid under a mining lease.

1. The proviso limits the amount of royalty to be paid except in the case of precious stones, to a sum not exceeding 10 per cent on the net profits. The net profits are often extremely difficult to ascertain and it has been considered better not to limit the royalty by any reference to profits but to leave it to be fixed by some more practical method. The Government may be trusted to deal with royalties in a business like spirit and not to exact royalty which would be burdensome or prohibitive.
